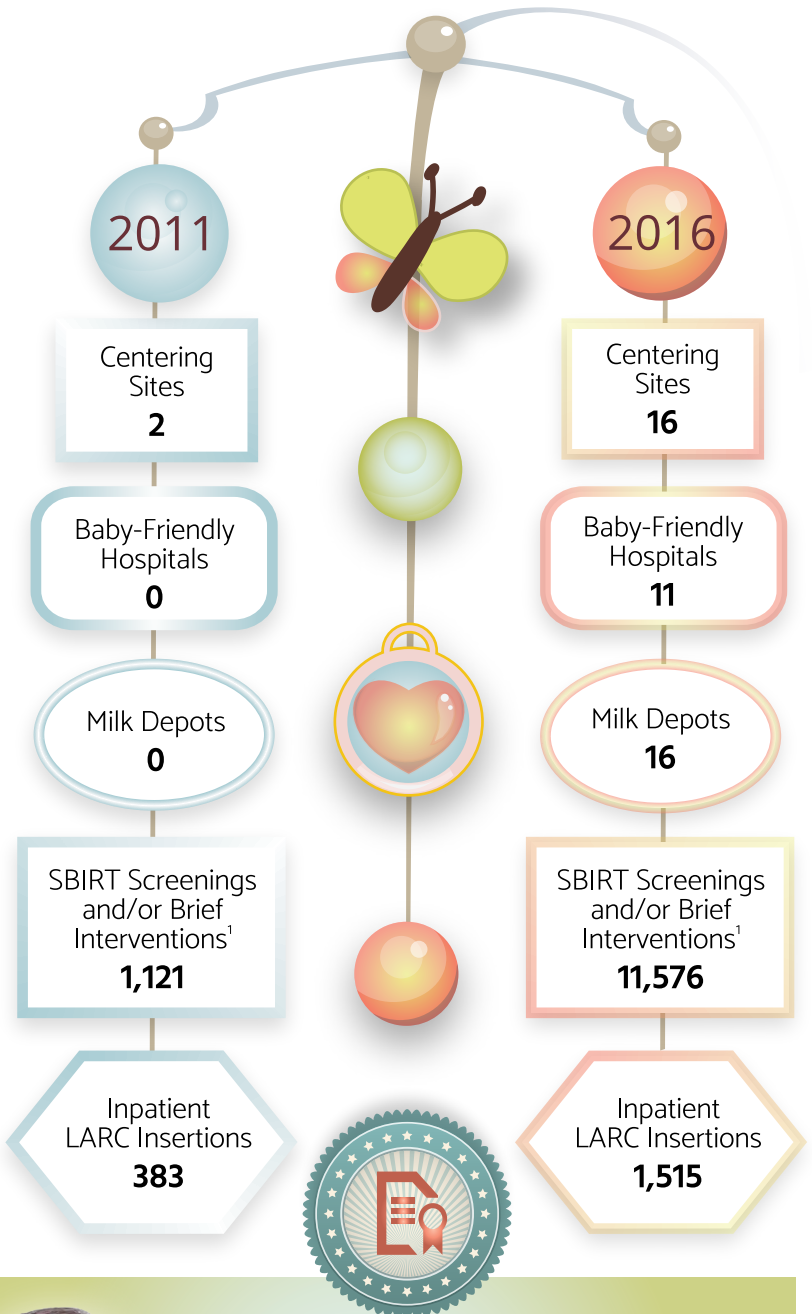
Marking Key Achievements of the SC Birth Outcomes Initiative



Launched in 2011, the South Carolina Birth Outcomes Initiative is a collaboration of more than 100 stakeholders across the state focused on improving maternal and child health for those enrolled in SC Medicaid.
